Vikas Bharti, Bishunpur emerged as a movement in 1982 and then registered under the Society Registration Act 1860 as non-government organization in 1983. The organization has its origin in Bishunpur, one of the most backward block of Gumla district. In the year 1983, Mr. Ashok Bhagat, Secretary Vikas Bharti started living together with tribal groups and revived the Tana Bhagat movement in Bishunpur. The entire Bishunpur hill was malaria prone area. The team of Vikas Bharti started working for the community by making them aware of health and sanitation issues. Gradually the behavioral pattern of the primitive tribe started changing. Food habit changed people started realizing the importance of natural resources Jal ( water) , Jungal ( forest), Jammen (Land) and Janwar ( Animals), Crop cultivation started in the area. People were made aware about sustainable utilization of forest resources and proper management of natural resources so as to meet the social, ecological, economic cultural requirements.

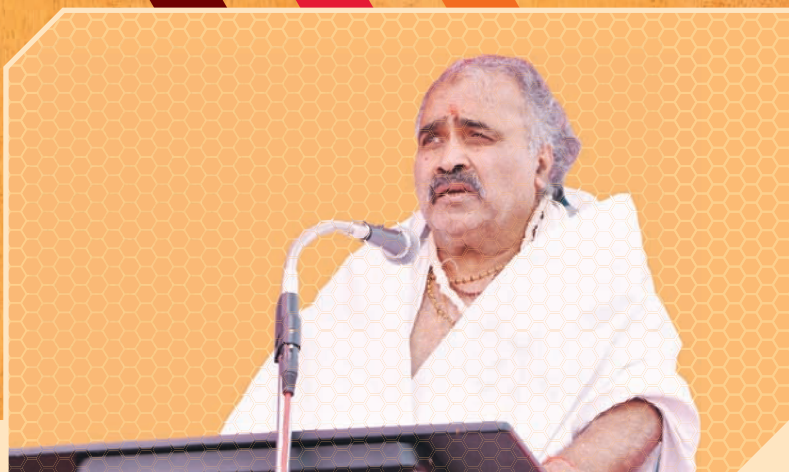

## *A few words from the* **SECRETARY**





The focus is now shifting from simple education to skill enhancement and employability. The year marked to commemorate 150th Birth Anniversary of great Mahatma Gandhi ji . I became one of the fortunate person to be nominated as executive committee member under the chairmanship of Honorable prime Minister of India for commemorating 150th Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. Commemorating 150th Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhiji we have conducted "Karyanjali" in all parts of Jharkhand. Huge plantation drive was organised all across Jharkhand covering 15000 villages. To propagate Gandhian ideology before the local people and youth, Padyatars, Marathon, Cycle race, Football tournaments were organised in various districts of Jharkhand.

ONGC supported us under its CSR activity to construct a 14 bedded Hospital in Bishunpur block of Gumla District. The ground floor of the Sukka Birjia Smriti Hospital was inaugurated on 28th May 2018 by the Chief Minister of Jharkhand. Considering the enthusiasm of local residents we have decided that first floor of the Hospital will be totally dedicated to women by establishing maternity ward. The formal inauguration of the Common Facility Centre (CFC) or Lok Suvidha Kendra, under SFURTI was also inaugurated on May 28, 2018, by Hon'ble Chief Minister of Government of Jharkhand

We confronted with multiple problems during the initial days in 2009 and gradually gained experience by overcoming all hurdles in running National Mobile Medical Unit (NMMU). We are satisfied the way we served the rural people residing in the remote areas all across Jharkhand. For the last two years we repeatedly requested the department to pay attention on the bad conditions of the vehicles. But unfortunately the matter was not considered seriously. Keeping all these things in mind we have decided not to go for the bidding process of NMMU. We regret for the same.

I express my sincere thanks to all those individuals and institutions/organizations including the State/Central Governments and National/Foreign donor agencies for their valuable support and cooperation in successful implementation of the programme/project activities of our esteemed organization during the reporting year and also in preparing this report.

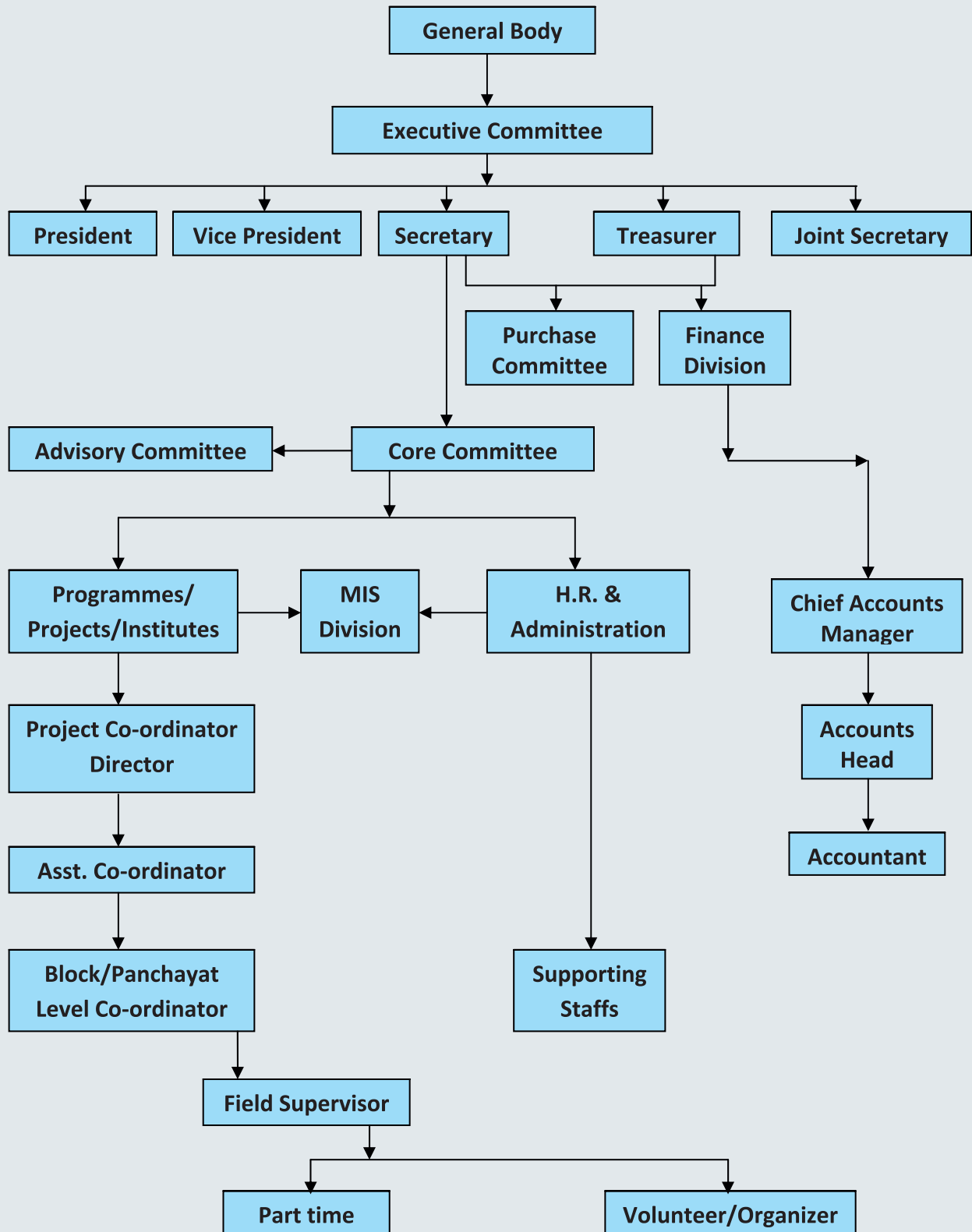

## ITS TRUST WITH PEOPLE

### IN JHARKHAND



There comes a time when one looks back in history in order to introspect and appreciate one's tryst with Time. Vikas Bharti Bishunpur, a voluntary organization rooted in the soil of tribal State of Jharkhand. In its 36 years of arduous journey with the people of one of India's beautiful geographical regions, Vikas Bharti Bishunpur (registered under Society Registration Act, 1860, set up on 14th January, 1983) today prides in having enabled tribes of Jharkhand on Education, Healthcare, Livelihood, Water Conservation, Ecological Conservation, Agriculture, Food Processing, Horticulture, Bee-Keeping among many other things. Though the good works of the organization has its spread all across Jharkhand, main concentration is in Gumla—a district and geographical region, noted for its scenic beauty, tribal cultural epicentre and historicity. When it looks back, it finds that the tribes in the region today can proudly walk shoulder to shoulder with the rest of the larger national and international community, at the same time being able to keep their language, culture, religion and tradition.

The journey began with a baby-step when three zealous young men—Mr Mahesh Sharma, Late Dr Rakesh Popli—both engineering graduates from IIT, Kanpur and Mr Ashok Bhagat, an alumni of Gorakhpur University, arrived in Gumla's Netarhat Valley, famously known as Queen of Jharkhand's scenic landscape (then in United Bihar), inhabited by tribes and primitive tribe groups (PTGs), with the sole aim of making the world there a bit better to live in. After an initial survey of

situations here, they decided to work on issues like Education, Health, Poverty, Community Mobilization, Ecology, Language and Culture and Skill Development. A socio-economic forum called 'Vikas Bharti Bishunpur' was formed in order to give reality to the dream that twinkled in the eyes of the three zealous men for this region.

Vikas Bharti opened the gateway to self employment and self-reliance by enhancing villagers' traditional skills and arts. It supported the rural mass with technological inputs, fiscal inputs, marketing network and human resource development. On the way as it progressed, concepts like GRAM SWARAJ ABHIYAAN emerged—encompassing in it movements like Right to Information (RTI), Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA), VAN ADHIKARITA, Right to Education Act, and Health—all of which entailed working with the Government agencies alongside the people, the tribes of the region. Today, it has the privilege of serving under-privilege people of all 24 districts of Jharkhand. Empowerment of youths and women is a mission that is seen through the endeavors of their socio-cultural, sports and other day-to-day activities. The organization has its headquarters in Bishunpur, Gumla and Co-ordination office at Ranchi, Jharkhand.

Vikas Bharti believes that development can only be actualized through meaningful, long-term and strategic partnership with community-based institutions, Government Agencies, National and International Agencies willing to help the poor.

At present Vikas Bharti is the most trustworthy and largest partner of the Government. Besides, many national and international agencies have come forward to partner with its endeavours to ensure deprivation-free society.





## Evidence of Development Impact in the Operational Areas

- Behavioral change amongst the primitive tribal groups of Gumla district. PVTGs shifted from animal hunting to agriculture practices to sustain livelihood.
- Awareness generation on Health and Hygiene practices amongst the Schedule Tribes and Primitive Tribes. People became conscious about the preventive measures on various water-born diseases, especially malaria.
- Education promotion models established in Gumla District were replicated in entire Jharkhand and Bihar.
- Construction of Sato Dam with community mobilization at a height of 1200 feet became an eye-opener for agriculture planners and engineers.
- As many as 65 innovative Agriculture technologies developed by KVK Gumla, being replicated in entire district.
- Strong grass root level institutions such as Dharti Raksha Vahini, Gram Swaraj Abhiyan, Women SHGs, and Farmers Clubs etc, are rendering service in all districts of Jharkhand.
- More than 15000 people in Jharkhand are gainfully employed by entrepreneurship and skill development training programmes of Vikas Bharti. Concept of Mobile Panchayat Health Worker replicated in entire Jharkhand state by the Government of Jharkhand.
- Continuous research and recommendations to the Government based on the field-reality of the situation of tribal people by Tribal Research Centre of Vikas Bharti, often influenced the policy of State Government on different issues of tribal and indigenous people. Recently conducted long awaited Panchayat Election is an illustration of efforts of grass root institution developed by Vikas Bharti.
- Education and livelihood opportunities for deprived girls and orphan youths through Jan Sikshan Sansthan, Gyan Niketans, Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Kendra and Saksham Jharkhand Kaushal Vikas Yojana of Vikas Bharti, have created enthusiasm among the deprived section of the society. Parents are now keen to send their children in different schools and vocational courses. Inclination of girl children towards education has increased everywhere.
- Youth mobilization programmes Yuva Vikas Mahotsava initiated in 90s has received tremendous response in the entire State. Now, without the assistance of Vikas Bharti, youths are being able to organize these events in their respective blocks. Vikas Bharti has built a number of statues of great tribal leaders of yesteryears so that the tribal youths can know about them and follow the path of integrity and sacrifice by remembering their ancestors great works.

## Present training Programmes in Bishunpur:

The organization has suitable and sufficient infrastructure for carrying out various trainings. It has its own food processing industry managed by women self help groups in Bishunpur Gumla and also has an established marketing channel all across Jharkhand.

### ● Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Kendra :

Vikas Bharti Bishunpur, in collaboration with Delhi based agency Foresight Edutech Pvt Ltd. got the opportunity to run five Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Kendra (PMKKs), in Jharkhand. Every year around 750 trainees are getting benefit from this Centre located in Bishunpur Gumla. Centre is well equipped with modern instruments for imparting quality training to the deprived and deserving youth population in and around Gumla District.

### ● Training on Scientific farming through KVK:

Indian Council For Agriculture Research has been supporting Vikas Bharti Bishunpur for last two decade to run Krishi Vigyan Kendra in Gumla District. KVK is capacitating farmers through principles of 'Teaching by Doing' and 'Learning by Doing'. The Technologies developed at KVK is being well tested at the field level before replicating it amongst large number of farmers.

### ● Training and Demonstration Center :

Established in Balatu village in Bishunpur known as the VAN VIGYAN KENDRA managed by women farmers. Indigenous technology and bio fertilizers

are used for horticulture, vegetables, herbal plants, and floriculture. This unit works as a research center that helps farmers understand the best ways in which drought resistant crops can be cultivated by experimentation with inter cropping to grow plants suited the climate.

### ● Training of front Line Workers :

Front line workers play an important role in ensuring Maternal and Child Health in rural areas. With the support of Social Welfare Department, GoJ Vikas Bharti provides trainings to frontline workers at its Angan Wadi Workers training centre located at Bishunpur in Gumla District. The centre caters the training need of Anganwadi Workers in Gumla, Simdega and Latehar districts of Jharkhand.

The significant outcomes have been improved capacities of Anganwadi workers in service delivery on maternal and child health through Anganwadi centre. During the year Job course orientation training for SEVIKAS was organised in which 73 SEVIKAS participated and 8 days orientation course training was also organized for 85 SAHAYIKAS of Gumla District.

- **Karigar Panchayat :**

To ensure livelihood security Vikas Bharti has established a well furnished training infrastructure cum common facility centre at Bishunpur. The centre is facilitating traditional artisans, craftsmen, women SHG members to adopt new technologies, quality control measures and marketing of the produce. This unit is working for the expansion and refinement of trades like metal work, dokra/dhokra metal casting work, welding, wood craft, bamboo craft, jute craft, food processing, mushroom cultivation, bee keeping, tailoring and animal husbandry.

- **Training cum demonstration of Rural Development model for high level Government functionaries/ Trainees/ Interns:**

Every year high level officers arrives for Project demonstration from the Central Administrative Office, New Delhi. Besides during the year students studying in reputed universities and institutions from all across India such as IIT New Delhi, Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS), Mahatma Gandhi Central University, Motihari, Bihar, Presidency University Bangalore, UPES Dehradun Woodstock School, Mussoorie, Banaras Hindu University, University of Petroleum and Energy Studies, Symbiosis Law School, Hyderabad, Symbiosis Centre For Media And Communication Pune, Indira Gandhi National Tribal University Amarkantak, Birla Institute of Technology, Mesra, Institute of Finance and International Management Bangalore, IIM Indore, National University of Study and Research in Law, Ranchi, XISS Ranchi came to Bishunpur for their internship programme.



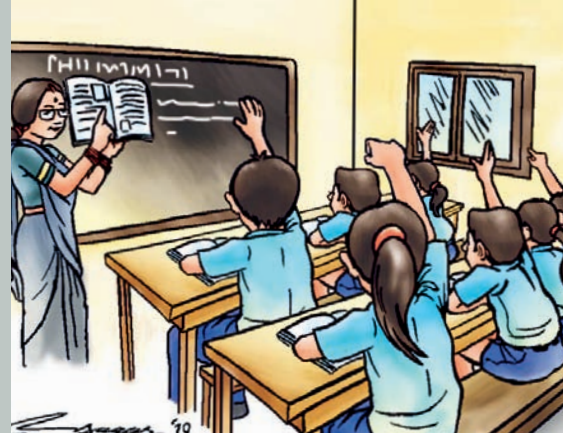

# Glimpses of activities and its impact on community : **EDUCATION**



Vikas Bharti Bishunpur has always tried to align the activities with its Vision and Mission. We believe education plays a primary and vital role in the holistic development and empowerment of the weaker section of the society. We have developed various models to provide education facilities to the children's of deprived and tribal communities. Our aim is to cover the unreached section of the society to build a just society.

Educational interventions by the organization are based on various approaches to include children's based on their needs; these are

- Residential Centers (Ashrams)
- Formal Schools
- Public Private Partnership Model
- Coaching Center
- Child Protection



## **Vikas Children Academy**

Primary Education in English medium created an unbelievable impact in the area. At present the Academy has 41 children studying in Nursery and KG classes. Van facility for children and equipped with joyful learning environment has been ensured. People residing in remote villages of Bishunpur block are sending their children in this English medium school. The school has created a huge aspiration in the area.

## Formal Schools

The primary goal behind setting up formal schools is to provide classroom based quality education to the children's from vulnerable tribal and backward families. Details about the schools covered under this category and the contribution made by them during 2018-2019 are mentioned below:

## Residential Centers (Ashrams)

Residential center is available for both Boys and Girls of Tribal and deprived communities. These centers have homely atmosphere with well equipped academic, infrastructure and logistic facilities. Residential centers provide round the clock supervision to the students with respect to academics, skill development activities and extracurricular activities for the overall development of the students. Through this facility our organization is aiming to reduce the school drop-out rate among the deprived and tribal communities.

During last F.Y i.e. 2018-2019, total beneficiaries from residential centers were 824 students (Boys-416 and Girls – 408). Details about these centers are provided below:

## Public Private Partnership Model

Vikas Bharti Bishunpur in partnership with the Department of Tribal Welfare, GoJ is providing education facilities to the children from the areas which are unreached. This model covers four schools under three districts (Gumla, Pakur and Sahibganj) of Jharkhand i.e. PTG School Tushgaon (100 students enrolled last year), PTG School Sahibganj (100 students enrolled last year), PTG School Maheshpur (100 students enrolled last year) and ST School Jehan Gutwa (84 students enrolled last year).

## Tribal Study Center

The centre basically does research and studies on tribal issues. It also enhances the capacity of tribal deprived students through the operation of coaching center. Coaching center provides classes for the preparation of competitive exams such as Bank P.O., Clerk, SSC, Railways for the students from tribal and weaker section of the societies. In 2018-19, 187 students enrolled themselves and 16 students got selected in various government organizations. This model has helped in increasing employment among tribal and backward communities.

## Other Initiatives/ Activities



### Helping students of KGBV

Vikas Bharti has collaborated with the International agency 'Save the children' and 'Proctor & Gamble' to strengthen and improve the knowledge base of the students of KGBVs. Through this project we covered 7 blocks of Gumla district. The aim of this project is to identify the weak or average or below average students of KGBV and provide special classes to them on the subjects covered in their classes like, English, Mathematics, Science, General knowledge etc. These classes are taken by the teachers appointed by our organization to provide qualitative knowledge to the students to bring them at par with other students in class.

## Protection and Welfare

### Children Homes

Started in 2013, children home is run by Vikas Bharti with the objective of rehabilitating tribal girls and boys in need. At present children homes are operation in three districts – Gumla, Sahibganj and Dumka. This is based on the concept of providing shelter with suitable environment and fulfill basic necessities of the needy children. Children of these rehabilitation centers are also given opportunity to enroll themselves in the various vocational training or skill development programs run by the organization. Details of 2018-19 is given below:

## After Care Home

After care home is operated in Dumka, last year out of 28 children 14 were united with their families. This program is operated with the support of Department of Women, Child Development and Social Security.

The objective of this program is to provide security and institutional care to the youth and adolescent women from age group of 18 to 21. These are the group of women and children who are accused of some anti social act and are charged under Juvenile Justice Act.

## Nari Niketan

Nari Niketan is a rehabilitation center in Gumla for Women. The objective is to provide protection and ensuring their rights. This center supports women who come from vulnerable and difficult situation and provide them home like facility. They are provided with opportunity to get training in Stitching, embroidery, toy making, food processing, mushroom cultivation, mobile repairing and as frontline health worker.

During last year, out of 18 women in the center 13 were united with their families.

## Childline

Child line project started 4 years back in October 2015. The aim of this program is to identify and help trafficked children, children who are socially abused or missing, victim of child labor, natural disaster, drugs, and hazardous job. Through this program we identify the families of these children and unite them. Last year 51 such children's were identified and united with their families.

## Empowerment of Adolescent girls and young women Project Tejaswini in Dumka

The objective is to improve completion of market-driven skills training and secondary education for adolescent girls and young women in the district.

### Summary of Progress

The project envisages operationalisation of 129 Tejaswini Kendra & 1078 Tejaswini Club in the district. Intensive activities have been started in three Blocks of the District The Youth Facilitators along with Kendra staff visited all household of each AWC catchment area for listing the Adolescent Girls and Young Women (AGYM) in three blocks Dumka Sadar,

Jama and Masalia. 81790 household survey carried out and 35231 AGYW Identified. Seven days induction training was organised for AGYW at club level (AWC/School) to orient them on Tejaswini project and its services. Till now 264 batches training completed in Dumka Sadar, Jama & Masalia blocks in 253 clubs. After completion of 7 days training interested AGYW enrolled as club member. Community mobilization and sensitization programmes have been initiated in remaining 7 blocks of the District.

# HEALTH SANITATION AND NUTRITION



Since inception Vikas Bharti Bishunpur is working directly with the primary stakeholders in service delivery mode by running dispensaries and Hospitals and simultaneously performing a role of a technical agency which provides resource and technical support to Government programs by taking the learning and experience of service delivery for broad based replication.

Jharkhand is malaria prone with large number of people affected by malaria during rainy seasons and diarrhea in post rain period. Every year a month long campaign is organised covering almost all blocks of Jharkhand involves, community meetings, health check up camps, use of awareness materials, application of bleaching powder, medicated mosquito net and providing linkages with Government programmes.

## Welfare Hospital Banmakri, East Singhbhum

A 50-bedded hospital providing quality services in remote & rural areas through PPP mode with Tribal Welfare Department, Govt. of Jharkhand since 2009. It is situated at Banmakri under Gurabanda block of East Singhbhum district. Hospital has been providing various types of medical services for treatment of patients in OPD/IPD, X-Ray facility, Pathological Test facility, Major and Minor Operations, Institutional Delivery, ECG, Ultra Sound, Ambulance, Eye Care Unit and ANC/PNC. During the last year 33282 patients registered, 215 patients undergone major surgery, 2148 undergone minor surgery. 5004 pathological tests were conducted throughout the year.

## Welfare Hospital Basardih, Lohardaga

Hospital situated at Basardih in Lohardaga block of Lohardaga District. It is also a public private partnership between Vikas Bharti Bishunpur and Tribal Welfare Department, Govt. of Jharkhand. Vikas Bharti got this opportunity in October 2018. Hospital is providing various types of medical services for treatment of patient in OPD / IPD, X-rays facilities, pathological test facilities, major and minor operations, institutional delivery, ECG, Ultrasound, Ambulance, Eye Care Unit, ANC-PNC etc. from October 2018 to March 2019, 2194 patients benefited from this hospital.

## Sukka Birijia Smriti Hospital:

Rural hospitals don't just play a vital role in healthcare reform, they also provide essential emergency and primary care to those vulnerable people. Vikas Bharti run a medical dispensary in Bishunpur, named Jeevan Jyoti Arogya Niketan since 1984. In the year 2017 the dispensary has been converted into 14 bedded Hospital. More than 19000 families benefitted from this hospital last year.





## National Mobile Medical Unit

Since 2009 Vikas Bharti Bishunpur has been running National Mobile Medical Unit (NMMU) in 23 districts of Jharkhand through 28 mobile medical units. We served around 66 Lakhs residing in the remote areas within 9 years of operation.

### Main Objectives of NMMU

- Access to health care services in hard to reach areas.
- Provide high quality health care services available in underserved areas
- Improve and enhance the health care services to people, especially for medical consultations and medical care for patients who live in the rural areas of above mentioned areas.

In the year 2018 we continued the services till the month of June. During this period our services reached to the deprived patients all across Jharkhand. 1,72,345 people benefitted, 22,540 Pathological tests were done, 3642 cases have been referred for better health care.

## Water Sanitation and Hygiene

Since 2012 Vikas Bharti Bishunpur has been running WASH project with the collaboration of UNICEF in three districts of Jharkhand i.e Ranchi, Chatra and Ramgarh. Last year main concentration was in two districts Ranchi and Chatra

During the last year 9 blocks were covered in Ranchi and Chatra Districts. Technical support was provided in 3745 Toilet construction in these two Districts.

### Impact:

- Created Enabling Environment for the sanitation work in working areas
- Strengthened involvement of Gram Sabhas on sanitation programme
- VWSC activities and programme strengthened
- Ensured the smooth Supply Chain Mechanism
- Increased Awareness level among Community on safe sanitation & Hygiene practices
- Our team members motivated villagers in construction of HH toilets, as a result 2500 HH toilets were constructed by the community members.
- More than 75 % Toilets are in regular use.



## Building Ownership and Momentum for Effective Implementation of SDG-2, Target 2.2 and WHA Nutrition Targets in 6 Panchayats of Gumla Block covering 20 villages

### Objectives

1. Ownership and awareness on nutrition targets by the state Government.
2. Effective implementation of the nutrition targets by the state Government.
3. Strengthening actions and collaboration between civil society, academic institutions, community groups and common citizens for deepening work around SDG 2, target 2.2 and WHA targets.

### Primary Outcomes

1. Increased priority given to implementing nutritional targets for children under 5, adolescent girls and pregnant and lactating mothers (SDG 2.2 and WHA targets) in Government decision making at all levels.
2. Increased community ownership and public accountability for nutrition targets and NFSA entitlements and on crèches.

## Suraksha: Partnership for improving maternal and child survival outcomes in hard to reach areas of Latehar

Partnership for improving maternal and child survival outcomes in hard to reach areas of Latehar by Vikas Bharti Bishunpur that commenced in April 2018 to achieve positive health outcomes for mothers and children in the Saryu Action Plan Area of Latehar of Jharkhand. The Saryu Action Plan Area covers 12 Panchayat of 4 Blocks of the district, Bendi, Nawagarh and Tarwadih Panchayat of Latehar Block, Barkadih Panchayat of Manika Block, Ganeshpur, Haratu and Chungru Panchayat of Barwadih Block and Kotam, Ghasitola, Karwai, Rud and Chorha Panchayat of Garu Block. During the intervention, Vikas Bharti teamed up with UNICEF, Jharkhand to strengthen access and entitlement of basic maternal and child health services to the marginalized communities in a geographically hard to reach community comprising of 114 villages lying in 12 Gram Panchayats in the Saryu Action Plan Area of Latehar district.

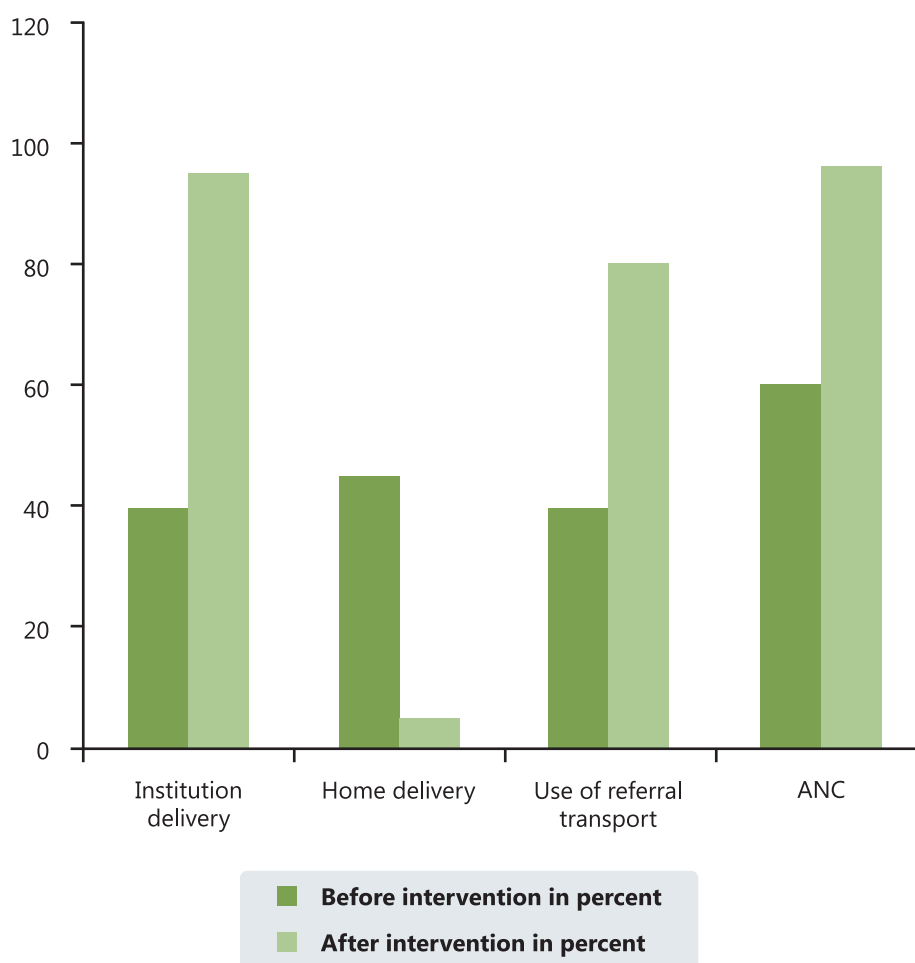

- Interview of pregnant women and mother of neonate about their health access Positive Changes

Under project Suraksha, Gram Sabhas were strengthened with the formation of standing committees in 70 revenue villages. About 450 VHSNC members have been trained on health planning at village and panchayat level. During the project period 136 Sahiyas including 65 Sahiya Sathees have been trained and strengthened on the importance of Home Based New Born Care (HBNC). 90 out of 114 Gram Sabhas have been strengthened in the project intervention period and are now holding regular meetings and discussing on community health and nutrition issues. In 13 Health Sub Centre of our intervention area, 968 institutional deliveries have taken place. Through VHND sessions, 31 high risk pregnant women have been identified and they counseled by Sahiya, AWW and ANM for safe delivery. 11 high risk newborns have been identified in the intervention area and all have been referred for availing proper health services. 9 sick new born have been referred to SNCU of district hospital.

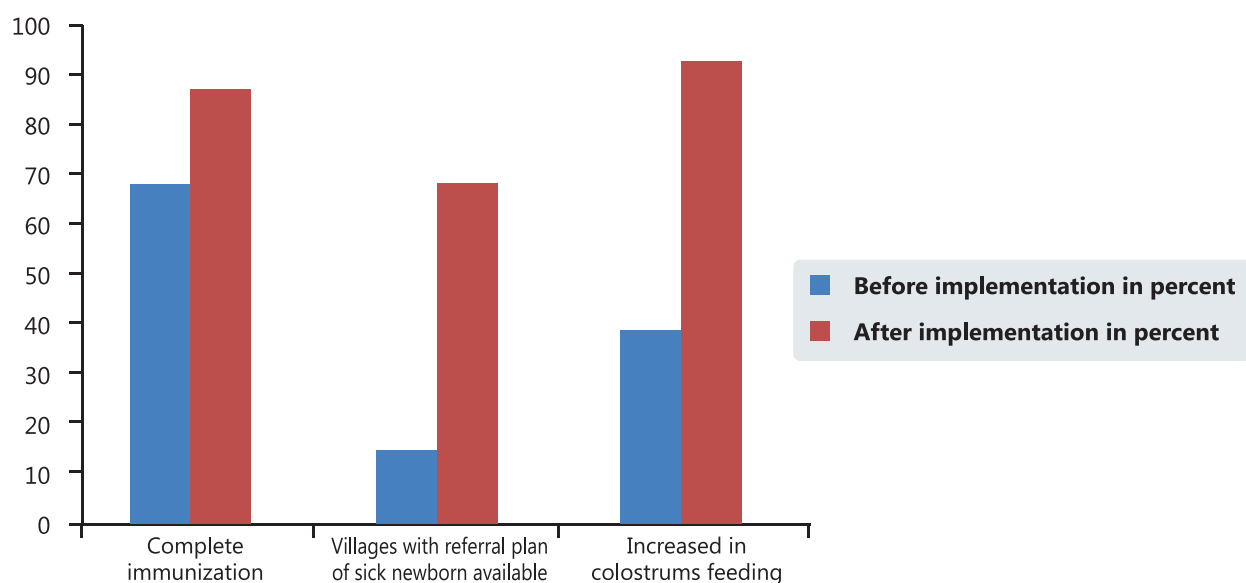

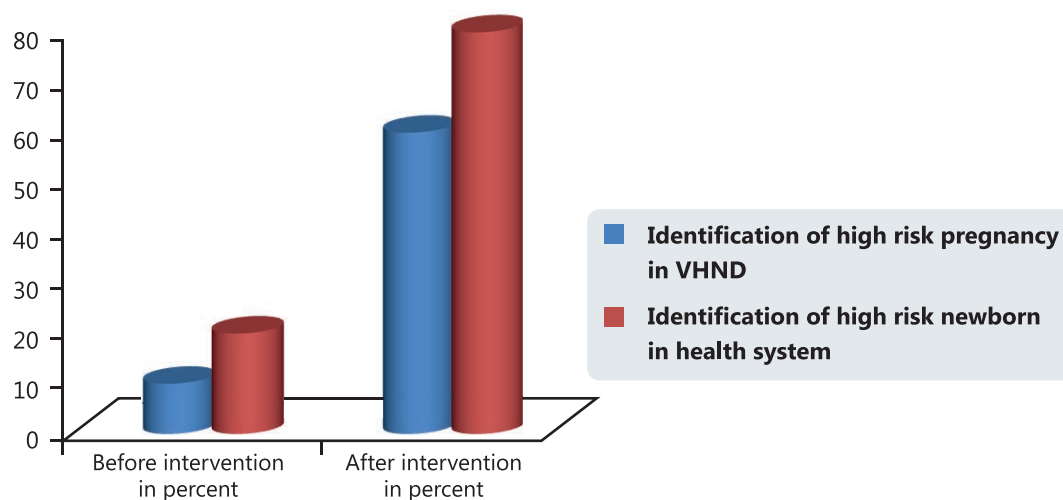

Vikas Bharti Bishunpur has focused on agro-horticulture promotional activities such as introduction of modern farm practices, farm inputs, development of nutritional garden, promotion of social forestry, crop demonstrations, soil and water conservation, rain-water harvesting and rational use of irrigation water, etc. The support of ICAR, New Delhi to Krishi Vigyan Kendra in Gumla has empowered Vikas Bharti for initiatives such as promotion of livelihood through farm sector development.

### The prominent features of the KVK are :

It is an institution that help in building scientific attitude in farming community by organizing training for farmers which includes even women and rural youth.

It help in connecting scientific innovations with farmers through field demonstrations and even encouraging them for practice which could yield more crops and better income

It also provide orientation to the extension personnel to train and facilitate themselves with latest agriculture technologies, so that they can execute for transforming farm sector

### Van Vigyan Kendra

Also known as forest science center which has been established by Indian Council of Forestry Research and Education (ICFRE) of the Ministry of Environment and Forest, Govt. of India. Its main objective is to cater to the field of research in Silviculture, soil and water conservation techniques, afforestation techniques, also techniques for forestry extension, organic farming, and composting technique etc For Organic Manure production, medicinal and fragrant plants



farming and nursery, 5 trainings were conducted and the total number of participants were 153.

Van Vigyan Kendra witnessed visit of women self-help group, trainees, entrepreneurs, farmers and students. The total number of visitors or participants were 1137.

### Promotion of Aromatic and Medicinal plants



Organisation is implementing Promotion of Aromatic and Medicinal plants in non timber produce programme in Bishunpur region with the support of Jharkhand Livelihood Promotion Society since 2018. under this programme 2 farmers field schools and 2 cluster hiring centres have been established. TULSI plantation is being done in 25 acres of land and Lemon grass cultivation promotion has been initiated in 13 acres of land. 1327 farmers are engaged in cultivation and collection of plants having medicinal values.



## Krishi Single Window Center

Jharkhand has become the first state in India to launch a single-window facility for farmers, an initiative that earned the praise of many dignitaries from all across India.

The Programme is Supported by Department of Agriculture, Govt. of Jharkhand and started in July 2016. Vikas Bharti Bishunpur got the opportunity to operate SWCs in 164 blocks of 24 districts of the state

Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS) established in 2003( supported by Ministry of HRD Govt.of India), Registered under Society Registration Act provides vocational training to the illiterates, neo-literates and rudimentary young boys & girls in the age group of 15 to 35 years, thus, ensuring employment to the trainees

## Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Kendra

Vikas Bharti, Bishunpur, in collaboration with Delhi based agency Foresight Edutech Pvt Ltd. got the opportunity to run five Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Kendra (PMKK), in Jharkhand. The programme is supported by National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC). The centres are located in GUMLA, CHATRA, PALAMU, GARHWA, and LATEHAR District.

The PMKK is a training setup with modern amenities corresponding to the trade in which training is imparted. The objective of PMKK is to provide training to the marginalised and weaker section of society thus enabling them to earn livelihood.





## Achievements of last year :

PMKK centre provides training on mobile repairing, electrician, Data entry operator, tailoring and TV repairing. During the year 2443 candidates received training from these 5 centres and 993 trainees got employment.

## Saksham Jharkhand Kaushal Vikas Yojna

**Vikas Bharti Bishunpur** has been running two Saksham centres in Gumla and Ranchi Districts Since September 2016.

### Objectives :

- To train candidate in age group of 18-34.
- To develop and upgradation of job oriented or enterprise skill in the trainees.
- Overall Personality Development, Computer Literacy, Financial Literacy and EDP of the trainees.



In Ranchi Centre Sewing machine operator and Beauty therapist trainings were conducted. 501 adolescents received training and 285 got employment

- In Bishunpur centre 151 trainees received training in Sewing machine operator and dairy farming. 35 candidates have been placed in different organisation.

## NRLM-MGNREGA-CFT CONVERGENCE

NRLM-MGNREGS-CFT Convergence Project is an initiative of Department of Rural Development, Government of India, to improve quality implementation of MGNREGS. Vikas Bharti Bishunpur is implementing CFT Project in 5 blocks of Gumla and Lohardaga districts. Gumla Sadar, Ghaghra & Palkot blocks in Gumla district and Kuru and Senha block of Lohardaga district respectively. 5 blocks, 82 panchayats and 223 revenue villages cover under the project. Vikas Bharti Bishunpur is implementing CFT project since 1st August, 2014.

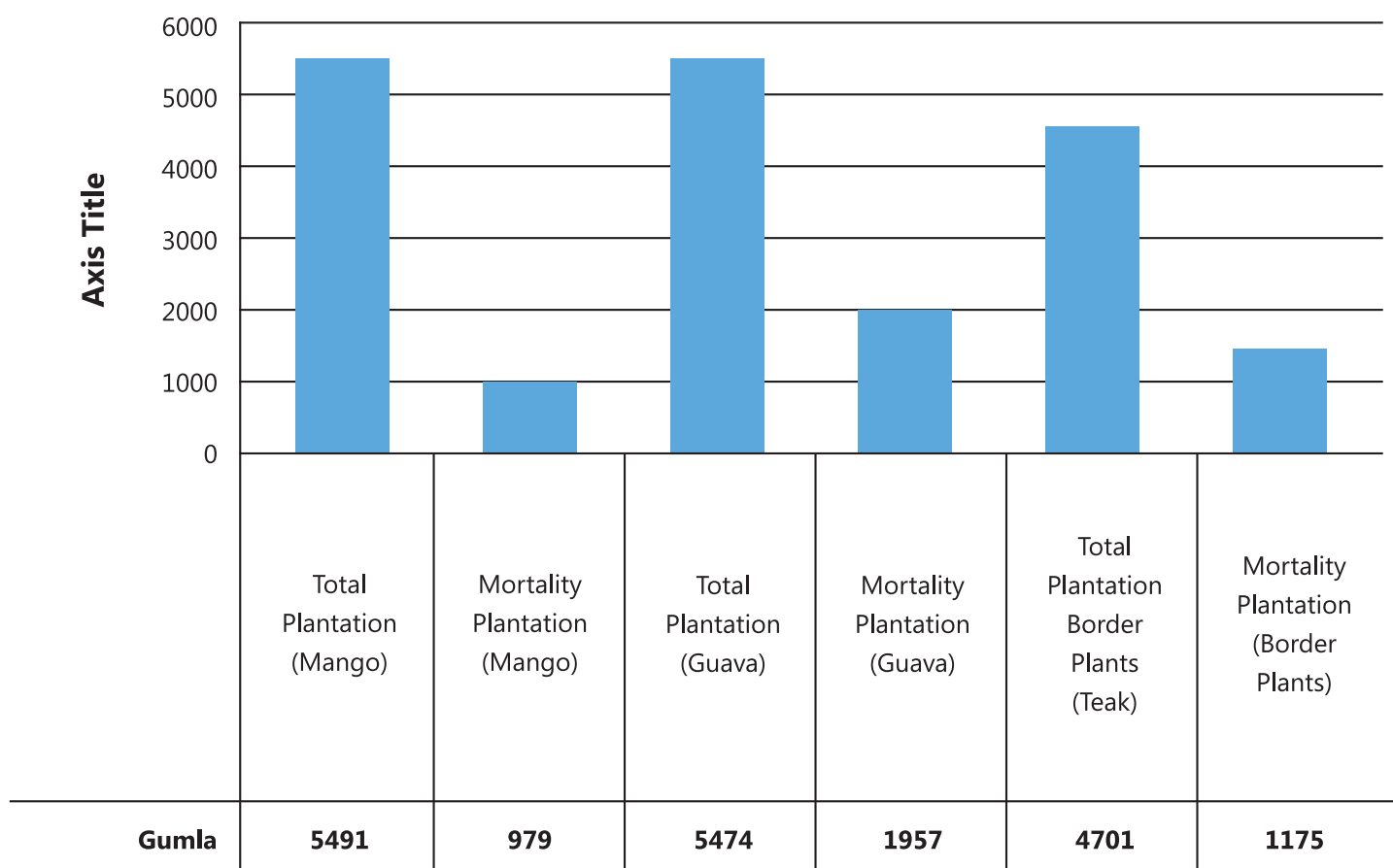
## Wadi Project, ITDA, Gumla

“Wadi” means small orchard which is actually a tree-based farming system that consists of fruit tree suitable to the area or a combination of trees with forestry species. Two or more tree crops are selected in Wadi model to minimize biological and marketing risks. In five years, a poor village of 100 families can get converted into an orchard of a 100-150 acre producing hundreds of tones of fruits.

### Project Aim

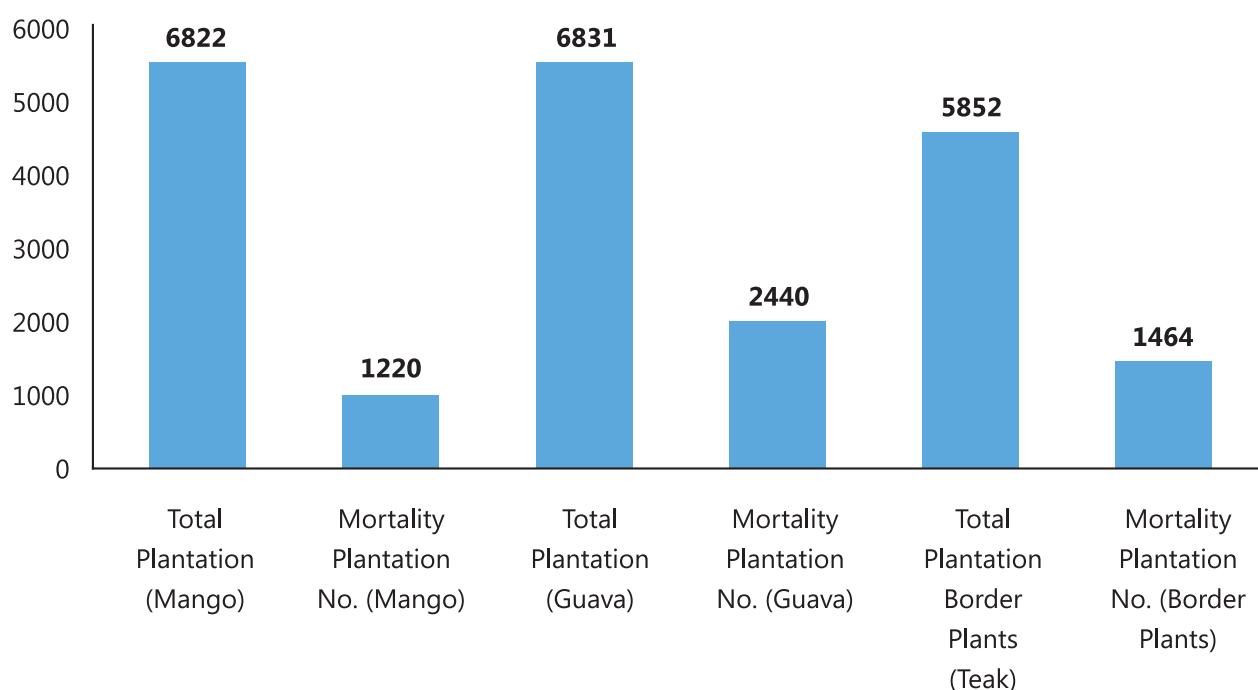
The programme aims at reducing the migration of tribal people to urban areas by providing them livelihood in the form of income and basic necessities like fuel wood, timber and cattle fodder. The programme will assist tribal families in Gumla Sadar & Raidih blocks of Gumla District in Jharkhand by giving assistance to develop orchards and related activities.

### Gumla Block



The above figures reveal that total plantation of Mango, Guava and Border plants, and plantation against mortality in 4 Wadi Samity (Asni, Mokro, Semardih and Shivpur) of Gumla Sadar Block. Total 5491 numbers of Mangos, 5474 numbers of Guava and 4701 Border plantation was done in July 2017. whereas against mortality plant, total 979 numbers of Mango, 1957 Guava and 1175 Border plantation was completed in the month of July 2018.

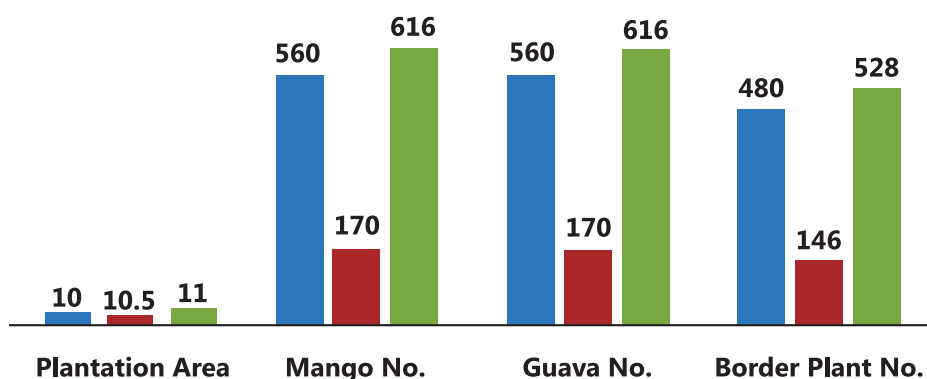
## Raidih Block

Similarly Wadi Samity Mokro has 3.05 acre of land having 170 Mango, 170 Guava and 146 Border plant. Wadi Samity Shivpur has 11 acre of area with 616 Mangos, 616 Guava together with 528 border plant.

## Training on Cash Crop Promotion amongst ST Farmers

A cash crop or profit crop is an agricultural crop which is grown for sale to return a profit. Indian Cash Crops refer to those crops that are grown generally for money and the very term Cash Crop differentiates it from subsistence crops which feed the live stocks of the producer and his family. Cash Crops in India form the strong base over which the Indian trade and commerce flourish both within and outside the country.

### Project Goal & Objective

The overall goal of this project is to emancipate 2000 selected individuals at their own plots on promotion of cash crop.

Thereby, the objects of the project include:

1. To promote cash cropping
2. To make these selected or identified farmers role models for others to replicate or adopt the best practices
3. To promote organic farming, reducing the input cost

### Establishment of Piggery unit:

On 12th November' 2018, an event was organized by Vikas Bharti Bishunpur at Batuatoli in Netarhat Panchayat of Latehar District. During the event, 100 "T&D" piglets were equally distributed amongst 20 identified beneficiaries (5 each; 4 female and 1 male) under "Establishment of Piggery Unit" Project at Latehar. Feeds for the piglets were also distributed to the beneficiaries.

## CSR Activities

With the assistance of ONGC one community toilet with solar based water and electricity connectivity is getting constructed in Bishunpur.

100 bedded hostel for PMKK students in Bishunpur by ONGC support has been completed.

With the support of Cholamandalam General Insurance Company first floor of hostel for girl students has been constructed in the Bharno.

### Activities with the assistance of KVIC

Under Pradhan Mantri Rojgar Srijan awareness camp was conducted in 7 places.

40 pottery artisans were given advance training and electric pottery wheels were distributed to them.

A state level workshop was organized in Ranchi With Financial Institutions in which Minister of State for Finance, GoI, Sri Shiv Pratap Shukla was the chief guest.

Another programme was organised In presence of State Finance Minister in Ghaghra, Gumla in which more then 8000 women of Gumla and Ghagra Block had their direct communications with the Minister.

**With the assistance of NABARD under LEDP programme a training for Bee Keeping was imparted to the women.**

**With the assistance of TERI, Mumbai** the four centers of Vikas Bharti Gyan Nikitan, Singidie Ashram, Jatra Tana Bhagat Vidya Mandir and Koyleswar Nath Vidya Mandir got electricity through Solar System. Apart from this the main center is also connected with the Solar System.

For Mukhyamantri Smart Gram Yojna Shivrajpur Panchyat MoU was done on 1st November 2018.

With CINI, Jharkhand in Gumla Sadar Block nutrition advocacy program is being conducted.



## Social Activities

Environment Protection, Tree Plantation and Malaria, Diarrhea eradication program was conducted from 14th to 15th July 2018. During these programmes around 32 thousand fruit plants were planted. In 150 villages malaria and diarrhea prevention awareness generation program was conducted.

On 22nd June 2018, Hul Divas was celebrated in Singbonga Museum, Vikas Bharti Bishunpur.

On 4th August 2018 under Maharaja Madra Munda series of lecture, a lecture on 5th Schedule and Tribal development was organized.

On 23rd August 2018 on the eve of Padmashree Ramdayal Munda's birth anniversary a convention was organised on tribal issues.

On 9th February 2019, Telanga Kharya, 219th birth anniversary was celebrated.

### **Commemorating Mahatma Gandhi Jee's 150th Birth Anniversary, the Karyanjali programs**

On 1st October 2018, Late Kartik Oraon Cycle race was organized from Lohardaga bakshi dipa to Chingri in total 51 KM with 450 participants.

On 2nd October Vikas Marathon was organized from Ghaghra to Chingri 28 KM in which 706 boys and 236 girls participated.

On 3rd October Singbong Marathon was organized from Netarhat to Chingri in total 28 KM and 942 participants out of which 706 boys and 236 girls were there Rank holders from 1 to 10 were awarded for all three days.

The occasion of closure event of three days Cycle race and Marathon race was marked by Karyanjali and Sankalp Sabha was organized in Chingri, in which participants from Gumla, Lohardaga, Chatra, Lathehar and Palamu districts were present. The chief guest was Honourable Governor of Jharkhand, Smt. Draupadi Murmu.

On the eve of Mahatma Gandhi 150th birth anniversary, in accordance to Karyanjali. Village level tribute meeting were organized in 1250 villages with 68750 participants.
