Vikas Bharti, Bishunpur emerged as a movement in 1982 and then registered under the Society Registration Act 1860 as non-government organization in 1983. The organization has its origin in Bishunpur, one of the most backward block of Gumla district. In the year 1983, Mr. Ashok Bhagat, Secretary Vikas Bharti started living together with tribal groups and revived the Tana Bhagat movement in Bishunpur. The entire Bishunpur hill was malaria prone area. The team of Vikas Bharti started working for the community by making them aware of health and sanitation issues. Gradually the behavioral pattern of the primitive tribe started changing. Food habit changed people started realizing the importance of natural resources Jal (water), Jungal (forest), Jameen (Land) and Janwar (Animals), Crop cultivation started in the area. People were made aware about sustainable utilization of forest resources and proper management of natural resources so as to meet the social, ecological, economic cultural requirements.

Vikas Bharti has been working with the most backward and under privileged communities in 24 districts of Jharkhand. The organization has been extending full support to the community to ensure their rights and entitlements. The organization has its headquarters in Bishunpur and Coordination office at Ranchi.



The world has seen unprecedented change in the last two years and pandemic has changed the world order. Where societies and grassroots communities struggle with the pandemic in both social and economic aspects. Now the role of the non-governmental organizations become crucial in such time.

Since the emergence of the movement in 1982, the organization Vikas Bharti Bishunpur has had a vision for the inclusive development of the poor and marginalized sections of society. In the last four decades, the Vikas Bharti Bishunpur has taken the effort for the vision and developed the sustainable model in the undivided Bihar & later on in Jharkhand. In the span of last four decades the organization has taken interventions in Health, Education, Livelihood, Gender Empowerment, Natural Resources, Child welfare, and empowerment of tribal communities.

The organization has partnered with various stakeholders in the journey for four decades Union government, State government, International funding partners, Corporate, and donor agencies. Our relationship with our partners has been evolved on trust and mutual vision and we are carrying those trust from long associations. Some of our partners are India Development Relief Fund, CAPART, Ministry of Handicrafts, Govt. of India, Ministry of Tribal Welfare, Department of Social Welfare, GoJ, ICAR, Bharat Rural Livelihood Foundation, Oil & Natural Gas Corporation Limited (GoI).

In the financial year 2020-21, the organization has partnered with Save the children and BRLF on the special interventions of Build it better and Watershed programs. The organization has reached more than 10 thousand households in the Pandemic by providing them relief on social and economical aspects.

Since the Pandemic has changed the scenario, the organization has put special emphasis on the creation of a livelihood model across the vertical of the Vikas Bharti Bishunpur with an idea of community empowerment.

I am happy to share the 38th Annual Report of the organization with all my stakeholders and national internal partners. This report will reflect the impact of the organization on the vision of inclusive development.

With the evolution of time and changing the domain order, the organization is restructuring and bringing new ideas for creating more sustainable models to have a long-lasting impact. New group operational experts have been inducted into the team of Vikas Bharti Bishunpur.

1. Four Decades of VBB (1983-2022)

1.1. Background

The organization Vikas Bharti Bishunpur emerged through a people's movement in the year 1982 and then turned into a professional entity as Non Governmental organization in 1983 under the society registration act of 1860. The organization has origin in the Bishunpur block of undivided Bihar later on in Jharkhand. The organization has worked closely in partnership with the government and other support agencies for transforming human lives and tribal communities across the state of Bihar.

The team of Vikas Bharti started working for the community by making them aware of health and sanitation issues. Gradually the behavioral pattern of the primitive tribe started changing. Food habit changed people started realizing the importance of natural resources Jal (water), Jungal (forest), Jameen (Land) and Janwar (Animals), Crop cultivation started in the area. People were made aware of sustainable utilization of forest resources and proper management of natural resources so as to meet the social, ecological, economic cultural requirements. Later on when the state of Bihar has been bifurcated and a new state Jharkhand has been formed in the year 2000. The organization has started working closely in partnership with the state government along with other partners on issues of Education, Livelihood, Health and community empowerment projects. To transform human lives the organization has collaborated strategically with Partners and implemented the projects to achieve the vision. This resulted in the quantified change in human lives.

The organization has developed trust with the partners and aligned the vision of the organization with its partner's vision for inclusive development. This resulted in a long-term partnership with states, national and international agencies. In the current difficult time, the organization is working with more than 50 projects in partnership with the state Government of Jharkhand, the Government of India, Corporate and other international funding bodies.

The work of the organization has been widely recognized at various levels and resulted in a national recognition of the Padam Shree award conferred to the secretary cum social activist of the Vikas Bharti Shri Ashok Bhagat by the Government of India in 2015.

The organization has expanded its efforts in difficult times to support the communities for livelihood and economic empowerment. The organization has reached more than 10 thousand households in the pandemic and provided social and economic support.

1.4 Governance of VBB



VBB has held all mandated Governing Board and executive committee meetings as per the rules and regulations.

VBB holds quarterly meetings and reviews the progress of each and every program. Based on the matrix the board decides the strategy and reviews the implementation by being actively involved inperson in the project locations.


In 2020-21, the organization has formulated a Research Advisory Group and capacity building.

1.6. Accountability

- In the last four decades, the organization has set a high standard of transparency and accountability, Vikas Bharti has done full disclosures of its accounts and activities by placing both in annual reports and audited accounts in the public domain.
- Towards ensuring the complete transparency in the projects the VBB always has a third-party evaluation of the projects. which helps organizations to ensure better implementation of the projects.
- The organization has a system of tracking the accountability of the projects through the following methods.
 - Project Tracking The organization tracks the project's progress through daily reporting & monthly reporting.
 - Executive committee Members intervene in the field on ensuring the project outcomes.
 - Proposal Management Proposal development, submission, proposal pool management, and resource management.
 - Project Management Real-Time reporting with partners on planned activities. Knowledge sharing with the partners from the field. Third-party evaluation of the projects as per the need of the projects.





2. The Bishunpur Model

2.1 Background

The journey of Vikas Bharti Bishunpur has been emerged by three young social activists Shri Ashok Bhagat, Mr. Mahesh Sharma & Late Dr. Popali. Mr. Mahesh Sharma & Dr. Popali both were engineering graduates from the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Kanpur and Mr. Ashok Bhagat (Baba) was political science graduate from Gorakhpur University. These three individuals dream of an inclusive society where people of the marginalized sections should have access to the resources.

These three professionals started their intervention in the Gumla district of the undivided Bihar Later on in Jharkhand. Based on the interventions a model was developed called Bishunpur Model. Through this Model, solutions have been proposed in an integrated manner for education, health, livelihood and social issues.

2.2 Bishunpur Impact

The Bishunpur has been developed as a Model in the state. Which has been recognized by national and international stakeholders across the Globe. The center become the center for excellence where professionals across the domain come for research. How an integrated model can solve the problems of the communities at the local level. This Model has addressed the issue of Health, Education, Livelihood, and gender empowerment. The impact has been recognized by the Government of India in the form of Padma Shri to the Secretary of the organization Shri Ashok Bhagat allied Baba ji in the year 2015. The Bishunpur Model has brought a quantified change in the lives of Tribal communities.

2.3 Interventions at Bishunpur

I. Common Facility Centre (CFC):

The organization has established the Common Facility Centre at the Bishunpur Campus under the Scheme of Fund for Regeneration of the Traditional Industries (SFURTI) project approved from MSME to Vikas Bharti Bishunpur (VBB) in the year 2016. Scheme of Fund for Regeneration of the Traditional Industries (SFURTI) project approved from MSME to Vikas Bharti Bishunpur (VBB) in the year 2016. Under SFURTI, 600 artisans registered for employment generation: 300 for food processing and 300

for Honey processing. To continue the project after it's reporting period to KVIC and MSME, a Special Purpose Vehicle "Karigar Panchayat (KP)" registered as a trust with 67%-33% trustees from VBB and Artisans. KP is operating as trust under the guidance of VBB. KP provides services such as manufacturing of food products and honey bee development & processing. Since, KP does not have operating capital for Common Facility Center (CFC), a unit equipped with food and

honey processing machines, established under SFURTI project, therefore, KP provides CFC machines on rent to 3rd parties.

Vikas Mahila Swablamban Nyas (VMSN) has been working since 2009 as a trust to empower rural women in the field of food processing. VMSN has its own FSSAI and GST license to manufacture and market the product. Since VMSN had its own small production unit, therefore, to extend the production on the large scale VMSN needed a large unit. Therefore, with MOU between KP and VMSN, VMSN agreed to use CFC machines and for that VMSN provides certain amount / month as rent to KP for its artisans & technicians. Most of the Raw Materials (RM) purchased by VMSN, in the first priority purchased from KP artisans.

The products which has been produced from the CFC Unit has been marketed at local level and national level in collaboration with TRIFED.

II. Massive Training Infrastructure developed by the support of CAPART.

The organization has developed a massive training infrastructure in support of the Council for Advancement of Peoples Action and Rural Technology (CAPART) as a technical resource center. The center is supporting grassroots organizations by providing low-cost training space to them.

III. Training Institute for Rural Agriculture, Technology, Education (TIRATHE).

The organization is having a training institute for the training of Rural Artisan at Bishunpur Campus. The institute is providing the training to the grassroots communities artisans at free of cost.

IV. Accommodation facility for 1000 trainees.

The organization has an infrastructure in the Bishunpur Model which can accommodate 1000 trainees at a time. The organization is providing the space to the grassroots communities at low-cost model.

V. Hospital at Bishunpur Campus.

The organization has established a hospital in the Bishunpur Campus with the support of the Oil & Natural Gas Corporation. The hospital is providing quality health services to the rural poor, especially the tribal communities. The hospital provides both OPD & IPD facilities, X-RAY, Ambulance Service.

VI. Agriculture technology promotion development centre of Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK).

The Vikas Bharti Bishunpur is the key partner with the Ministry for implementing the Krishi Vigyan Kendra in the Gumla district. The organization is partnered with ICAR for operating the Krishi Vigyan Kendra. The KVK is supporting the rural communities in enhancing agricultural production at the district level and introducing new technology to the farmers across the state and district.

VII. Education & Capacity Building centers in Bishunpur

The organization has established a pool of educational institutions in the Bishunpur Campus from schools to skill training institutions like PMKVY & SJKVY. The schools cater to the poor and deprived children by enrolling them in formal education.

2.4 Way Ahead in Bishunpur

The Bishunpur Model has shown the solutions to social issues. This has a widely recognized model that how an integrated approach can resolve the issues at the grassroots level. On the way ahead the organization is implementing the new livelihood Models and strategic partnership with communities at the local level.

The organization is developing the partnership to bring more sustainable Models in the field of Livelihood, Capacity Building.

3. VBB Intervention in the Field

Background

As of March 2021, the VBB outreach is 18000 Villages across 180 administrative blocks of 24 districts of Jharkhand on various themes of social issues (Education, Health, Livelihood, Gender empowerment). The organization has experienced more growth since last financial year 19-20. In the financial year 2020-21, the organization has focused on the interventions related to the Pandemic response.

In the process of the interventions related to pandemic response, the organization has experienced the challenges of funds but the organization stands alone and goes ahead with the interventions.

3.1 Health, Sanitation & Nutrition

In 1982, the founder of the VBB has experienced that the poor marginalized communities especially (tribals) were struggling with health-related problems. These communities do not have access to proper health facilities, so the founders have decided to take health as prime focus, Vikas Bharti Bishunpur is operating Several hospitals in the state under the Public-Private Partnership Mode.

In the last four decades, the organization is still working on a similar vision. The organization is supporting the vision for quality health services access for all. In the initial period, the organization was working on spreading awareness among the people towards their health issues. Now the organization is working closely as a technical agency for the state health programs. The organization provides technical and implementation support to the state government of Jharkhand. The organization operates several hospitals in most geographical locations under the public-private partnership model.




I. Sukka Birijia Smriti Hospital:


In the difficult geographical terrain especially in the tribal areas, health is still a critical issue. The

Communities are still struggling to access quality health facilities. To have this the organization runs a medical dispensary in the Bishunpur Campus. In the year 2017, the medical dispensary has been converted into a formal 14 bedded hospital with support of the Oil & Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC). The hospital has been named on the name of the special committee member from the primitive tribe group Called Sukkha Brija. In the financial Year, 2020-21 more than 5000 patients have been benefitted and provided quality health facilities. The hospital has become one of the key centers in the time of pandemics.





The outreach of Sukka Birijia Smriti Hospital




II. Kalyan Hospital Hesal BASARDIH Lohardaga

The organization operates the second hospital in Hesal Lohardaga in collaboration with the state government of Jharkhand under the Public-Private Partnership Mode (PPP). The hospital providing quality is health services to the poor, especially the tribal communities. The hospital has various health facilities OPD, IPD, X-RAY, Pathological Services, Minor Operation, Family Planning, Ambulance, Dental Care, EYE Care, ANC/PNC, Free Medicine.




The outreach of Kalyan Hospital Hesal



III. Welfare Hospital Banmakri East Singhbhum

The organization operates the hospital under the Public-Private Partnership Mode with the department of Tribal Welfare (GoJ) in the Banmakri of Gurabandha block of East Singhbhum. The hospital provides quality health services to the poor, especially to the tribal communities. The hospital provides services like OPD/IPD, X-Ray, Pathological Test Facility, Major & Minor Operations. ECG, Ultra Sound, Ambulance, Eye Care.





3.2 WASH Sanitation.

The VBB is collaborated with the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) since 2012 to implement the WASH project in three districts of Jharkhand. In the financial year 2020-21, the focus was on the Chatra District of Jharkhand with a special project Titled - Creating sustainable sanitation model with community engagement approach on saturation in Chatra District of Jharkhand". The project has covered all 12 administrative blocks of the Chatra district.






3.3 Renovation of Anganwadi Centres:

Viakas Bharti Bishunpur got the opportunity from Gumla District administration to improve the key services of Anganwadi centre.

In order to ensure child friendly environment at AWC, renovation of the buildings TLM and play materials have been given to 30 AWCs in Gumla, Palkot, Chainpur, Basia and Kamdara Blocks. It was aimed to ensure 6 key services of AWC and to provide supportive supervision to frontline worker for various VHSND services such as Immunization, Health check-up, Nutrition & health education, referral services of sick and SAM children.







3.4 VBB Special Intervention on Response to Covid-19

In the unprecedented situation which developed with the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic and regular feedback from the communities across the state. The VBB decided to initiate interim and long-term relief measures for the families residing in the project locations. The VBB has constituted an interim committee of Volunteers, Executive Members, Field workers, and other members of the organization. The thought behind the committee is to guide the actions taken for the response of Covid-19.

The aim of the VBB Covid 19 response measures was to:

- a. Minimize the spread of the Covid-19 and create awareness among the communities.
- b. Mitigate the impact of lockdown imposed on the communities especially the poor and migrants labour, Tribal communities across the state of Jharkhand.



Additional Agriculture Allied Activities:

Promotion of Aromatic, Medicinal and NTFP Project

The Vikas Bharti Bishunpur has collaborated with the Jharkhand state Rural Development Society to promote the Aromatic Medicinal plants in the year 2018. The major operational Area of the project is the Bishunpur Block of the Gumla district of Jharkhand. In the last 5 consecutive years, the organization has achieved the 100% target of the project. The project operational Area is the Gumla district of Jharkhand.

Solar Lift Irrigation and Plantation:

In Rukki AND Kalludera village Promotion of irrigation through solar panel was done with support of ITDA Gumla. Pit digging was done for Mango and Guava Plantation. Size of pit measures 3 feet length, 3 feet width and 3 feet depth for both plantation.

Beneficiaries were informed about handling of solar energy based operation system. They were oriented that it will be an automatic irrigation system where the irrigation pump will be operated from solar energy. Irrigation done in 254.01 acre in the intervention area. Regular irrigation to plants during fruit development and maturity period improved the quality of fruits.

The programme aims at reducing the migration of tribal people to urban areas by providing them livelihood in the form of income and basic necessities like fuel wood, timber and cattle fodder.

WADI Project : Another initiative of the organization with the assistance from ITDA Gumla Objectives of the WADI project

- To ensure sustainable livelihood, food and income security of poor tribal household and promotion of a more efficient equitable self managed and sustainable exploitation of their natural resources.
- To build the capacity of WADI family unit.
- Encourage and facilitate drudgery reduction measures, off farming and confirming enterprises development specifically for tribal women.
- To increase the cropping intensity through intensive farming system approach.

Target Groups of the Project are 164 farmers in Raidih Block spanned over a space of 122.01 acres and 128 Farmers in Gumla Sadar Block with an area of 122 acres.

3.6 Education & Vocational Training.

The founders of the organization have given special emphasis on Education since the inception of the movement in 1982. The founders have a view that education should be inclusive for all and quality should be transformed. It can be used as the most powerful for bringing change in society. The organization has extended its arms to cater to education issues through various interventions with community engagements.

Formal Schools

The organization has an emphasis on education because it is regarded as the most powerful tool for the transformation of human lives across the world. So the organization Vikas Bharti Bishunpur (VBB) has given due significance to formal education. On formal education, the organization has emphasized Primary to secondary education. Through the steps in primary education, the organization has set up an English medium school for nurturing the future of the children from the geographical area of Bishunpur called "Vikas Children's Academy". Then the organization has set up various other schools to cater the need of the upper Primary to senior secondary for the poor and marginalized section of the society in the geographic location of Bishunpur. The aim is to provide low-cost quality education to the children of tribal families.



3.7 Skill Development & Capacity Building:

Karaundi and Telgaon, with a rural population of 12,976 cover an area of 38sq.km.


Vikas Bharti Bishunpur focused on 39 women SHGs in the cluster for Self employment of Women members in the community. Bamboo craft, YAM Pickle, Mango pickle, candle making, Papad, Tamarind processing seed processing activities were focused and after receiving training SHGs received machines and utensils to carry forward their activities.

3.8 RACE Project on promotion of Green Energy:

To ensure availability of Clean Energy Solutions (CES) accessible and affordable to the rural tribal communities of Jharkhand RACE (Rural Access to Clean Energy) Programme was initiated by the organisation in Bishunpur Gumla. 50 number of kitchen garden have been developed which fulfilled the daily requirement of vegetables for the whole family.





The way of cooking through eliminate the harmful smoke which cause respiratory health problem and it is safer than traditional stoves which uses firewood and coal which generate harmful smoke.

195 numbers of Adarsh Gram Survey was completed. It helped and make easier understanding about present scenario of electricity use by respondents, what they are using during the power cut or in the absence of electricity. What fuel they are using for cooking, uses of drinking water, uses of clean energy at home as well as in school, use of toilets in household etc.

3.9 Empowerment of Adolescent girls and young women Project Tejaswini in Dumka

Tejaswini Project started in the year 2017 with the objective to improve market-driven skills training and secondary education for adolescent girls and young women in the district.

Structure of Tejaswini

Tejaswini Club:

- One club consist of 2 AWC within 1.5 km distance
- One Youth Facilitator and one trainer in each club to support club operation at AWC or School building

Tejaswini Kendra:

- One Tejaswini Kendra in composition of 8 clubs
- Kendra Staff: There are three staffs: Cluster Coordinator, Counselor & Bridge Educator cum Life Skill Trainer to support in operation of Kendra & Club

Activities:

The project envisages operationalisation of 129 Tejaswini Kendra & 1078 Tejaswini Club in the district. Intensive activities have been started in 10 Blocks of the District. The Youth Facilitators along with Kendra staff visited all household of each AWC catchment area for listing the Adolescent Girls and Young Women (AGYM) in Dumka District. 185000 household survey carried out and 90768 AGYW Indentified. 1078 Youth facilitator received training, Life kill training imparted to 83147 adolescents girls. Sanitary pad bank established in 500 clubs. 4147 Adolescents within the age group of 14-20 enrolled in NIOs for matriculation and higher studies.
